New in version 5

SLS-2 changed to SLS 2.0, but prefix SLS2- maintained.

SLS 2.0 project notes organization

Motivation

An organization of SLS 2.0 documents had been established at the first SLS-2 meeting, but it turned out to be impractical: complicated document identifiers, possible confusion with different versions etc. Instead SLS 2.0 adapts to a well-proven PSI standard, which is authororiented with minimum additional bookkeeping requirements.

Templates

There are three templates for SLS 2.0 notes.

- MS-Word template, detailed version SLS2_template_detailed.dotx
 This is the original PSI document with very detailed documention on editing and approval, modification history, table of contents etc.
- MS-Word template, simple version **SLS2_template_simple.dotx** with only a mimum title page.
- LateX, simple version SLS2note.sty + PSI-Logo_narrow.eps/.png
 The style file defines the command \slstitle to produce the header.

The templates are located at afs/psi.ch/project/SLS2/Docs/Notes/Templates

Document identification:

The document identifier has the form SLS2-SSS-NNN-V

- SSSS is the author's short PSI short sign (initials + unit)
- NNN is a number (000-999) assigned by the author. It's up to the author's preference how to organize the numbering.
- V is an [optional] version number for document updates

Repository

The notes are stored at afs/psi.ch/project/SLS2/Docs/Notes/ in pdf format.

This folder has the standard access for the group sls2:users i.e. anybody from the group can do all actions on the files (access rlidwk).

For public access (and for non-afs-users) the notes are regularly copied to the web page http://ados.web.psi.ch/SLS2/Notes

File names

It is strongly recommended to give at least to the final **pdf** a meaningful name like **SLS2-SSSS-NNN_topic.pdf**

For example this file is named SLS2-SA84-002 sls2notes.pdf
